Summer rehearsals will take place in the Westwood High School Band Room from 6:30 - 8:30 on Mondays in June and July (except July 3). Concerts will take place on August 7 and September 23 in locations to be determined at a later date. The band provides the opportunity for students to meet and perform with other student and adult music enthusiasts. It also provides a way for them to maintain and build their musical skills over the summer.

Time to Register for the Prodigy Program for 2023-24!

Registration for the 2023-24 Prodigy Program session will open on June 5!

<u>Returning students</u>: If you are a returning Prodigy Program student, you will be automatically enrolled in lessons for the 2023-24 school year on your current instrument and with your current instructor. Students of Dave Rufino, Nigel Yancey, Xue Liu, and Abby Rodriguez will be enrolled as "TBA" students and assigned to new teachers in the Fall. If you are an existing student who wishes to change their registration (*e.g.*, different instrument, different teacher, new address or payment method), or if you wish to withdraw from the Prodigy Program, <u>please click here</u> to access the parent portal.

<u>New students</u>: If you are a new Prodigy Program student, please go to the Prodigy Program website to <u>create an account</u>. If you are unsure as to which instrument or teacher to choose, please contact the Prodigy Program Director at <u>prodigyprogram@westwood.k12.ma.us</u>.

<u>Please do not attempt to register or make changes to 2023-24 registration before June 5, because</u> <u>JackRabbit will not be able to accept 2023-24 registrations or changes to 2023-24 registration before</u> <u>that time</u>. We currently have a waiting list for several instruments, so I strongly encourage you to register now. We require your payment information upon registration, but no payment is due or processed upon registration. <u>Please also note that registration will close on October 31</u>. We will not be <u>able to register any students after that time</u>.

The Prodigy Program's phased-in tuition increases for the next two years are as follows:

Payment options:

- Pay in full upon registration; or
- Pay 50% in September and the balance by February 1, 2024; or
- Sign up for a <u>Monthly Payment plan</u> when you register. Please note that this will incur an additional one-time \$25 convenience fee; or

• Apply for <u>Tuition Assistance</u>, which may be available to families who demonstrate need. Tuition assistance depends on availability of funds.

<u>Please do not mail checks, applications or correspondence to the Prodigy Program office as our</u> <u>administrative staff remains virtual and is not on-site to receive mail at this time</u>. In-Person and Remote Lesson Options Continue

Due to demand for virtual lessons, this Fall, the Prodigy Program will continue to offer lessons in both in-person and remote formats. Upon registration, students will be able to choose remote or in-person lessons for the 2023-24 school year. Once students have chosen a format, students will be committed to that format for the entire school year. Remote lessons will be available for every instrument as well as voice, but may not be offered by every Prodigy instructor. That information will be available during the registration process.

A Friendly Reminder About Our Policies

In the interest of student progress, and with an effort to maintain a degree of fairness for both families and lesson instructors, the Prodigy Program previously established policies regarding lesson attendance, cancellations, and make-up lessons.

Upon registration, families are asked to make a substantial time and financial commitment to student's music lessons and classes. Prodigy Program instructors have also committed to teach a total of 30 lessons per year (this number may vary with individual registrations). Lesson teachers rely on the teaching income they receive from the Prodigy Program as part of their livelihood.

Established weekly lesson times are bound to flex at various points throughout the year due to illness, school holidays, weather cancellations, etc. Because both students/families and instructors have a mutual investment in their music lessons and classes together, the Prodigy Program has asked families and instructors to agree to certain guidelines in the event of a missed lesson or class. Our **current Absence and Makeup Policy** is set forth below. Please click here to read all of the Program's policies.

1. <u>Private Lessons:</u> Students are entitled to make up lessons for <u>two excused</u> absences. Excused absences are those in which (i) the student has provided at least 24 hours advance notice to the instructor (not the Prodigy Program Director), or (ii) the student is ill and cannot attend the lesson (whether or not 24 hours notice is provided). Absences for <u>any other reason</u> are not excused and are forfeited. <u>More than two absences of any kind are forfeited</u>.

2. <u>Semi-Private Lessons:</u> Because semi-private lessons involve other students, lessons are not made up when a student is absent.

3. <u>Classes</u>: Because classes involve other students, lessons are not made up when a student is absent.

4. <u>Teacher Absence</u>: A teacher's absence from a lesson or class will be made up by the end of the school year.

5. <u>School Closings and Holidays</u>: All lessons missed because of school closings for religious holidays or inclement weather will be made up.

6. <u>Credits and Refunds</u>: Tuition credits or refunds will be provided for long-term illness or injury.
